

TRIDUUM: MAUNDY THURSDAY



E HAVE, IN THE FIRST PLACE, THE CLEAR TEXT IN CHRIST'S VERY WORDS, "DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME" [LUKE 22:19]. THESE ARE INVITING AND COMMANDING WORDS BY WHICH ALL WHO WOULD BE CHRISTIANS ARE TOLD TO PARTAKE OF THIS SACRAMENT. THEREFORE, WHOEVER WANTS TO BE CHRIST'S DISCIPLE, WITH WHOM HE HERE SPEAKS, MUST ALSO CONSIDER AND KEEP THIS

SACRAMENT. THEY SHOULD NOT ACT FROM COMPULSION, BEING FORCED BY OTHERS, BUT IN OBEDIENCE TO THE LORD JESUS CHRIST, TO PLEASE HIM. HOWEVER, YOU MAY SAY, "BUT THE WORDS ARE ADDED, 'AS OFTEN AS YOU DRINK IT'; THERE HE COMPELS NO ONE, BUT LEAVES IT TO OUR FREE CHOICE." I ANSWER, "THAT IS TRUE, YET IT IS NOT WRITTEN SO THAT WE SHOULD NEVER DO SO. YES, SINCE HE SPEAKS THE WORDS 'AS OFTEN AS YOU DRINK IT,' IT IS STILL IMPLIED THAT WE SHOULD DO IT OFTEN. THIS IS ADDED BECAUSE HE WANTS TO HAVE THE SACRAMENT FREE. HE DOES NOT LIMIT IT TO SPECIAL TIMES LIKE THE JEWISH PASSOVER, WHICH THEY WERE OBLIGED TO EAT ONLY ONCE A YEAR. THEY COULD ONLY HAVE IT ON THE FOURTEENTH DAY OF THE FIRST FULL MOON IN THE EVENING [EXODUS 12:6, 18]. THEY STILL MUST NOT CHANGE A DAY." IT IS AS IF HE WOULD SAY BY THESE WORDS, "I INSTITUTE A PASSOVER OR SUPPER FOR YOU. YOU SHALL ENJOY IT NOT ONLY ONCE A YEAR, JUST UPON THIS EVENING, BUT OFTEN, WHEN AND WHERE YOU WILL, ACCORDING TO EVERYONE'S OPPORTUNITY AND NECESSITY, BOUND TO NO ONE PLACE OR APPOINTED TIME."

Beloved in the Lord, during this Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that prevents us from trusting in God and loving each other. Since it is our intention to receive the Holy Supper of our Lord Jesus Christ on this night when He instituted this blessed meal for our salvation, it is proper that we complete our Lenten discipline by diligently examining ourselves, as St. Paul urges us to do. This holy Sacrament has been instituted for the special comfort of those who are

troubled because of their sin and who humbly confess their sins, fear God's wrath, and hunger and thirst for righteousness.

But when we examine our hearts and consciences, we find nothing in us but sin and death, from which we are incapable of delivering ourselves. Therefore, our Lord Jesus Christ has had mercy on us. For our benefit He became man so that He might fulfill for us the whole will and law of God and, to deliver us, took upon Himself our sin and the punishment we deserve.

P So that we may more confidently believe this and be strengthened in the faith and in holy living, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, broke it, and gave it to His disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you." It is as if He said, "I became man, and all that I do and suffer is for your good. As a pledge of this, I give you My body to eat."

In the same way also He took the cup, gave thanks, and give it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." Again, it is as if He said, "I have had mercy on you by taking into Myself all your iniquities. I give Myself into death, shedding My blood to obtain grace and forgiveness of sins, and to comfort and establish the new testament, which gives forgiveness and everlasting salvation. As a pledge of this, I give you My blood to drink."

Therefore, whoever eats this bread and drinks this cup, confidently believing this Word and promise of Christ, dwells in Christ and Christ in him and has eternal life.

We should also do this in remembrance of Him, showing His death-that He was delivered for our offenses and raised for our justification. Giving Him our most heartfelt thanks, we take up our cross and follow Him according to His commandment, love one another as He has loved us. As our Lord on this night exemplified this love by washing His disciples' feet, so we by our words and actions serve one another in love. For we are all one bread and one body, even as we are all partakers of this one bread and drink from the one cup. For just as the one cup is filled with wine of many grapes and one bread made from countless grains, so also we, being many, are one body in Christ. Because of Him, we love one another, not only in word, but in deed and in truth.

May the almighty and merciful God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by His Holy Spirit, accomplish this in us.

- P Having heard the Word of God, let us confess our sins, imploring God our Father for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ, to grant us forgiveness.

Kneeling or sitting forward

Silence for reflection on God's Word and self-examination.

- I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

- **P** Do you believe that the forgiveness I speak is not my forgiveness but God's?

P Let it be done for you as you believe.

Standing

All may come forward and kneel at the altar rail to receive individual absolution.

The pastor absolves the penitents, laying his hands on the head of each and pronouncing the following absolution:

- In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the

 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.

After receiving individual absolution, the pastor dismisses the penitents with this blessing:

- Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; He will surely do it. Go in + peace.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Exodus 24:3-11

- A The Old Testament Reading for Maundy Thursday is from Exodus, chapter 24.
- \mathbf{A} In those days: Moses came and told the people all the words of the LORD and all the judgments. And all the people answered with one voice and said, "All the words which the LORD has said we will do." And Moses wrote all the words of the LORD. And he rose early in the morning, and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and twelve pillars according to the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he sent young men of the children of Israel, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed peace offerings of oxen to the LORD. And Moses took half the blood and put it in basins, and half the blood he sprinkled on the altar. Then he took the Book of the Covenant and read in the
- hearing of the people. And they said, "All that the LORD has said we will do, and be obedient." And Moses took the blood, sprinkled it on the people, and said, "This is the blood of the covenant which the LORD has made with you according to all these words." Then Moses went up, also Aaron, Nadab, and Abihu, and seventy of the elders of Israel, and they saw the God of Israel. And there was under His feet as it were a paved work of sapphire stone, and it was like the very heavens in its clarity. But on the nobles of the children of Israel He did not lay His hand. So they saw God, and they ate and drank.

- \mathbf{A} Brethren: When you come together in one place, it is not to eat the Lord's Supper. For in eating, each one takes his own supper ahead of others; and one is hungry and another is drunk. What! Do you not have houses to eat and drink in? Or do you despise the church of God and shame those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I do not praise you. For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This
- do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes. Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body. For this reason many are weak and sick among you, and many sleep. For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.

HOLY GOSPEL John 13:1-15

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the thirteenth chapter.



- \mathbf{P} Before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end. And supper being ended, the devil having already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray Him, Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going to God, rose from supper and laid aside His garments, took a towel and girded Himself. After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. Then He came to Simon Peter. And Peter said to Him, "Lord, are You washing my feet?" Jesus answered and said to him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but you will know

him, "If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me." Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head!" Grant that in such faith we may worthily come to Your altar to eat the very body and drink the true blood which Your Son has given for our redemption. In thanksgiving, we remember and proclaim the sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ, in whom we place our trust. Until His return, graciously receive our prayers, deliver and preserve us, for to You alone we give all glory, honor and worship, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.







About participation in the Lord's Supper:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. [Those coming to the altar for a blessing rather than Holy Communion are asked to cross their arms over their chest.]


