

TWELFTH SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY



T IS THE WORD (I SAY) WHICH MAKES AND DISTINGUISHES THIS SACRAMENT, SO THAT IT IS NOT MERE BREAD AND WINE, BUT IS, AND IS CALLED, THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST. 



PROPHECY Isaiah 29:17–24

A The Prophecy for the Twelfth Sunday after Trinity is from Isaiah, chapter 29.

In that day the deaf shall hear the words of the book, and the eyes of the blind shall see out of obscurity and out of darkness. 


HOLY GOSPEL Mark 7:31–37

sighed, and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." Immediately his ears were opened, and the impediment of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke plainly. Then He commanded them that they should tell no one; but the more He commanded them, the more widely they proclaimed it. And they were astonished beyond measure, saying, "He has done all things well. He makes both the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."





FIRST COMMUNION PRIOR TO CONFIRMATION

The pastor addresses the congregation:

Beloved in the Lord, in Holy Baptism this young person was born again as God's child and received into His Church. As a further gift of His love for us, our Lord Jesus Christ has given His Church the Sacrament of the Altar and invites His children to receive this Sacrament in faith for the forgiveness of their sin. The apostle Paul reminds us, "Let a person examine himself and so eat of the bread and of the cup," and "as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes." This candidate has received instruction and has been examined by the pastor regarding her sin and her understanding of the Sacrament of the Altar.

The pastor addresses the candidate:

You are about to be admitted to the Lord's Table. Holy Scripture describes the life of the Church and every baptized Christian with these words: "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." You are invited by our Lord to come regularly to hear His Word and receive His Sacrament. You will continue to be instructed and nurtured in the Christian faith and life. You are invited to confess your sins and receive the comfort of Holy Absolution. All this will help you live as the child of God you have been made through Holy Baptism.

Acts 2:42

In testimony of this faith and confession, I now ask you:

- **P** Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, in Jesus Christ, His only Son our Lord, and in the Holy Spirit?
- **R** Yes, I believe.
- P Do you believe that Jesus Christ, true God and true man, is your Lord?
- **R** Yes, I believe.
- P Do you believe that you are a sinner?
- R Yes, I believe.
- P Do you believe that Jesus Christ died for you and shed His blood for you on the cross for the forgiveness of all your sins?
- **R** Yes, I believe.

- **P** Do you believe that in the Lord's Supper He gives you His true body and blood for the forgiveness of all your sins and to strengthen your faith in Him and your love toward others?
- **R** Yes, I believe.
- Do you intend to continue to hear and receive the instruction of the Lord, confess your sins, and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully throughout your life?
- **R** *Yes, with the help of God.*
- I therefore invite you to the Lord's Supper to receive Christ's precious body and blood for the forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the ⅓ Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

The pastor addresses the congregation:

- Parents, and members of the congregation, the whole Church shares with you the responsibility and concern for the ongoing instruction and spiritual care of this young person. I now ask you, will you intercede for her in prayer and, as much as you are able, give her your counsel and aid that, in communion with the Church, she may grow up to lead a godly life to the praise and honor of Jesus Christ? Then answer: We Will, with the help of God.
- **C** We will, with the help of God.

- Grant, Holy Father, that all who eat today of this feast of joy may find in the Savior's body and blood a blessed foretaste of the feast to come, for the strengthening of their faith and the growth of their love. Lord, in Your mercy,
- **C** hear our prayer.
- O Lord, You gather us by the work of Your Spirit and dwell in our midst by Your Means of Grace for the sake of Your Son. Open our mouths to tell of Your name and declare Your praises to all who will hear. Lord, in Your mercy,
- C hear our prayer.

- P Gracious God, those who die in Christ rest in Him. With them we await the day when we are received into Your everlasting presence to the life that death cannot end. Receive our thanks for the mighty saints of old and for their witness preserved through the ages. Keep us in Christ, that we may be reunited with all who have gone before us. Lord, in Your mercy,

- Mighty God, You have done great things for us, delivering us from death to life through Christ, our Lord. Mercifully hear our prayers and answer them according to Your will for the sake of Your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.





About participation in the Lord's Supper:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. [Those coming to the altar for a blessing rather than Holy Communion are asked to cross their arms over their chest.]

God has blessed us with His inspired Word in the canon of Holy Scripture. From Genesis to Revelation, God has given us everything we need to establish the doctrine of His Church. Nevertheless, there are ecclesiastical texts that, while not inspired by the Holy Spirit, are still helpful in recording the history of God's people and clarifying biblical contexts. Even Martin Luther retained many of these texts in his German translation of the Bible. Lutherans since have also included them in their daily lectionary. And the Jews in Jesus' day made frequent use of them in their Septuagint (Greek translation of the Old Testament).

This might explain why the Bible itself makes references to them. For example, when Jesus calls Himself "the Light of the world" (John 8:12), it's in the context of Hanukkah which originated in 1 Maccabees. And the author of Hebrews refers to Tobit when he says, "some have entertained angels unawares" (13:2), and 2 Maccabees when Hebrews says, "women received back their dead, raised to life again" (11:35). Because these texts have been judged as worthwhile reading in the Church, we are taking time to discuss them in Adult Bible Study.
