EXHORTATION BEFORE GOING TO THE SACRAMENT

Based upon the Martin Chemnitz' Church Order for Braunschweig-Wolfenbüttel (Sehling 6/1.1:142, 1569 ed., pp. 22-25).

P My dearly beloved in God, forasmuch as we now purpose to remember and keep the Supper of our dear Lord Jesus Christ, in which His flesh is given to us for food and His blood for drink, not of the body but of the soul, it becomes us with great diligence each to examine himself, as Paul says [1 Cor. 11:28], and so to eat of this bread and drink of this cup. For no one is to receive this holy Sacrament except a hungry soul which knows his sin, fears the wrath of God and death, and hungers and thirsts righteousness. But if we examine ourselves, we find nothing in us but sin and death, nor can we in any way deliver ourselves therefrom.

> Therefore, our dear Lord Jesus Christ has had mercy on us and was made man for our sake, so that He might fulfill for us the Law and suffer all that we owe for our sins. And to the end that we might steadfastly believe this and joyfully confide in it, He took bread after supper, gave thanks, broke it, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you"—as though He were saying: "I was made man, and all that I do and suffer has been done as your own, for your sake, and to your benefit. As a pledge of this I give you My body for food." In the same way also He took the cup and said: "Take, drink of it, all of you. This cup is

the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you do it, in remembrance of Me"-as though He were saying: "Because I have come to your assistance and taken your sins upon Myself, I will offer Myself up for sin, shed My blood, obtain grace and forgiveness of sins, and so establish a new testament in which sin shall never again be brought to mind. As a pledge of this I give you My blood to drink." Therefore, whoever so eats of this bread and drinks of this cup—that is, whoever steadfastly believes these words which he hears and these signs with He receives—he abides in Christ and Christ in him, and he lives eternally. In so doing we are therefore to remember His death and heartily give thanks to Him for it, each take up another, even as Christ has loved us. For there is one bread, and we many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread [1 Cor. 10:17] and all drink of the one cup.

However, that we may all, in accordance with the teaching and admonition now heard, worthily receive the holy Sacrament together in true, genuine faith and repentance, let us call upon God the Father and sincerely ask His forgiveness for the sake of His Son, Jesus Christ.

- **P** Let us then confess our sins to God our Father.
- I, a poor sinner, confess to God my heavenly Father that I have, alas, sinned grievously and in many various ways, not only by outward, gross sins but also much more by inward, innate blindness, unbelief, doubt, despondency, impatience, pride, evil lusts, avarice, secret envy, hatred, and malice; that in many ways by thoughts, gestures, words, and deeds I have transgressed the most holy Commandments of God, as my Lord and God perceives, and I, alas, cannot so fully discern. But I repent and am sorry for them and heartily desire grace of God, through His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, and I pray that He would impart to me His Holy Spirit for the amendment of my life.
- The Almighty God has had mercy on you and by the merit of the most holy suffering, death, and resurrection of His beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, forgives you all your sins; and I, as an ordained minister of the Christian Church, announce to all who truly repent and who, by faith, place all their trust in the sole merit of Jesus Christ and who intend to conform their lives according to the command and will of God the forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- But to all who are impenitent and unbelieving, I say, on the basis of God's Word and in the name of Jesus Christ, that God has retained their sins and will certainly punish them.



About participation in the Lord's Supper:

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as he says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us, that they may show forth his death until he comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. [Those coming to the altar for a blessing rather than Holy Communion are asked to cross their arms over their chest.]




Prayer Before Receiving Holy Communion

Many Christians struggle with prayer even though it's an essential part of the Christian life. "What should I pray for?" they may wonder. "How should I pray?" "What if my mind wanders?" "What if I get stuck praying the same thing every day?"

When asked by his barber and good friend Peter Beskendorf for some practical guidance on how to pray, Martin Luther responded by writing this brief treatise, first published in 1535. This edition is a modern translation that brings us Luther's practical instruction, using his ITCP method:

- 1. Instruction
- 2. Thanksgiving
- 3. Confession
- 4. Prayer

This method anchors prayer in the catechism or other biblical texts, but allows the Holy Spirit to prompt thoughts via the Word, which may be chased more freely by the mind at prayer. Readers will find their prayer lives refreshed and invigorated as they become more comfortable raising supplications to God.
